Fortnightly Selection Statistics – 27 January 2010

1. Selection 27 January 2010– Skilled Migrant Category

The most recent selection of Expressions of Interest (EOIs) under the Skilled Migrant Category took place on **27 January 2010**

- **376** EOIs were selected that had a points total of **140** or above;
- **119** EOIs were selected that had a points total of **100** or more but less than 140, and included points for offers of skilled employment or current skilled employment in New Zealand.
- **48** EOIs were selected that had a points total of **130** or more but less than 140, and included 15 points for work experience in an area of absolute skill shortage.

As a result, **543** EOIs representing **1202** people were selected and will now undergo preliminary verification to determine if an invitation to apply for residency will be issued.

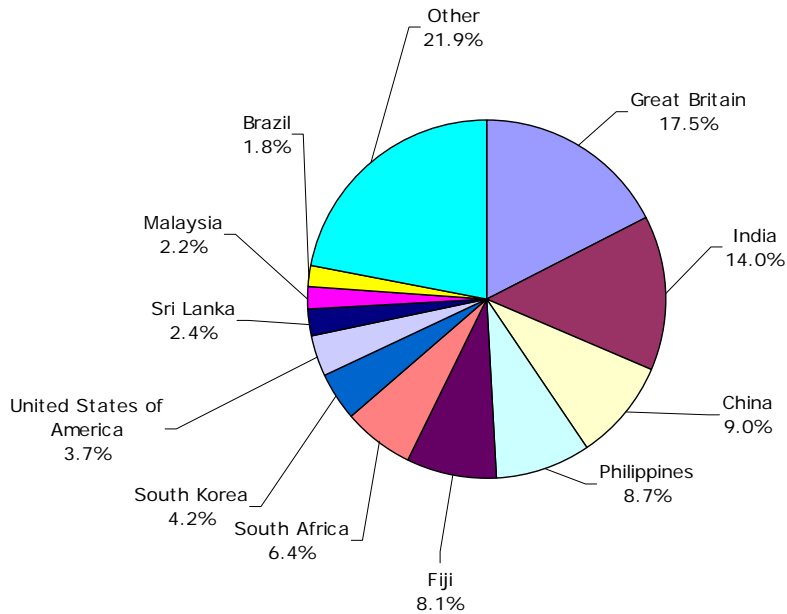

27 January 2010

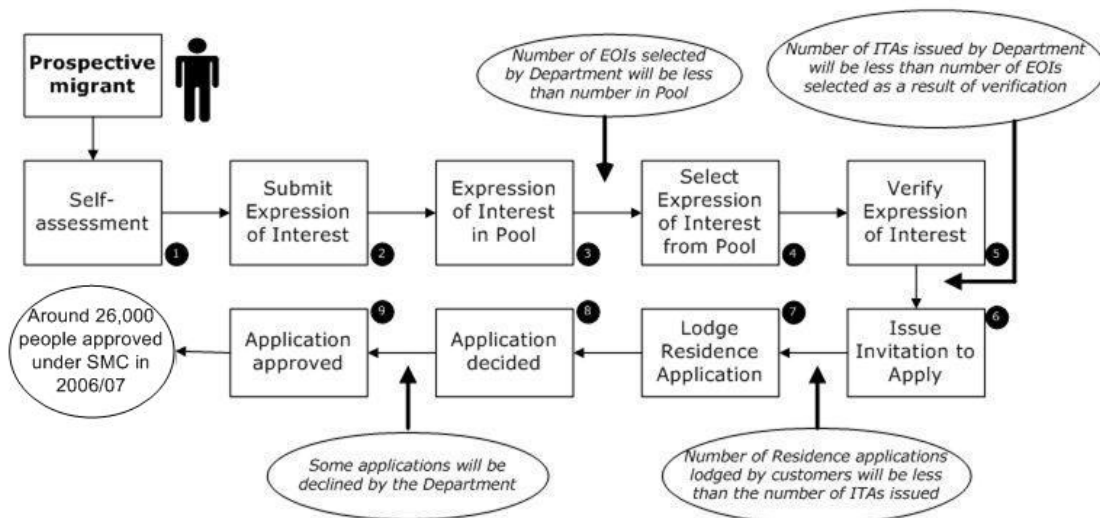


4. Statistics since December 2003
